



"Jamboree 2010...Over the Rainbow" Q & A

What is the Jamboree?

The Jamboree is a day filled with excitement and activities for **all** girls ages **3 through 18**. (Your group does not have to be a Girls Club to attend.)

How Do I Register For The Jamboree?

To register, simply complete and return the group registration sheet, competition entry form and payment by **April 30, 2010**. For convenience, you may register on line at www.ngacog.org.

How Much Does It Cost?

The cost per person is: **\$20 In Advance or \$22 At the Door.**

What Does the Price Include?

The cost includes lunch, prizes, materials, use of inflatable rides and games, spiritual sessions, general sessions and special attractions.

What Is The Cost For Adults/Chaperones?

The regular registration rate applies to everyone. **(We allow each church 2 drivers @ \$5.00.)**

Note: Unfortunately, due to economic times and rising Jamboree costs, we are unable to offer a parent/chaperone rate.

What If I Have Additional People to Register After I Have Mailed My Registration?

Please e-mail, fax or phone in your additional numbers. Additional registrations received before the Jamboree will be \$20 per person. Those registering the day of the Jamboree will pay \$22 per person.

Where Is The Jamboree?

The Jamboree will be held at **The Legacy Retreat Center** (our beautiful state campground) in Homer, Georgia. **Directions:** From Atlanta-Interstate 85 N, Exit 154 Martin Bridge Road, at top of ramp turn left and cross over the interstate. Turn left at the first road—Wilson Bridge Road. The campground is one mile on the right – brown fencing. Signage will be posted.

Can my Group Spend the Night?

- Groups traveling 100+ miles to the Jamboree are allowed to spend the night. However, this information must be noted on the registration form and payment for the rental of the dorm rooms must be received. (The Legacy may book completely, so please do not delay your reservation.)
- Check in 6:00 p.m. (No arrivals please after 10:00 p.m.)
- The charge is \$12 *per dorm room* (room sleeps 6 people.) Please note the number of people needing a bed and add the word overnight stay.
- An adult chaperone must stay in the room with the girls.
- **You will need to provide food/snacks for your group Friday night & breakfast Saturday morning.**
- The dorm will be the only building your group will be allowed to enter.
- Dorm assignments will be posted on the office glass door and dorm rooms.
- You will need to bring a sleeping bag/bedding, pillow, towel, soap and toiletries.
- The pool will be open from 7:00 – 9:00 p.m. (certified lifeguard on duty).

Does My Group Have To Participate In The Competitions?

The competitions are optional and are offered as an opportunity for your girls to participate as a group and have fun. If you choose not to participate, you may sit back and relax; there will be other areas of activity for you.

Will A Nurse and Certified Lifeguard Be On Duty?

Yes. A nurse will be on the campground throughout the day and will be located in the Clinic which is in the front of the Activities Building. Certified lifeguards will be on duty at the pool and lake area.

How Many Registration Forms Should My Church Send?

It is most helpful if you send one form per club/age group. *For example, if you have Little Sweethearts, Bluebellies, Joy Belles, and YLM's, you would send in four registration forms.*

What Do Counselors/Group Leaders Bring to Registration On May 15th?

- Competition items you will be submitting.
- Parental Permission Slip/Liability Release Forms (counselors keep for emergency use)
- \$22 for *anyone* not pre-registered (We allow each church 2 drivers @ \$5.00.)
- (Optional) Cash for the canteen and mini mall

What Should the Girls Bring?

Here are a few suggestions: Spending money, bathing suit (modest), change of clothes (should girls get wet in the bubble attraction), plastic bag for wet clothes, parental consent form/liability release form and energetic bodies. **What Should I Not Bring?** Please do not bring any valuable items (CD players, iPods, jewelry, etc.) Note: We are not responsible for lost or stolen items.

What Is The Schedule For The Day?

- **Registration 8:00 – 9:00 a.m. (Gym)**
- General session will begin at 9:00 a.m.
- Jamboree is on a rotating schedule - everyone can swim, play, shop, learn, be challenged, relax, eat and enjoy.
- Awards festival at 3:45 p.m.
- Jamboree will end at 4:30 p.m.
- **NEW...DOOR PRIZE FOR LADIES - \$100 CASH!** During the closing Awards Ceremony, a \$100 cash door prize for a counselor/group leader will be drawn – must be present to win.
- **NEW...DOOR PRIZE FOR GIRLS - YOUTH CAMP SCHOLARSHIP!** During the closing Awards Ceremony, one **Youth Camp Scholarship** will be drawn (girl between the ages 6 -18) must be present to win.

Should We Bring Spending Money?

Where possible, we encourage everyone to bring a few dollars. The snack shop is open throughout the day with candy, candy bars, soft drinks, chips, ice-cream you name it, etc. at a minimal cost. Also, the mini-mall is open with various priced items ranging from \$.10 to \$5.00.

IMPORTANT NOTICE REGARDING MALE DRIVERS & BOYS

In recent years, increasing numbers of men have been attending the Jamboree. We understand groups may need to utilize male drivers. However, for the security and comfort of the young ladies, we ask that males refrain from being around the event areas – especially the waterfront/pool areas. (Only approved Jamboree male staff members, i.e., certified lifeguards & lakefront security, are not permitted in the waterfront areas.) Finally, although we realize that some of the preschool programs for the local church include boys, we ask that only girls participate. We appreciate your cooperation in this matter.

What Should We Wear?

Casual/Play clothes are acceptable for all activities. If you wish to wear your uniforms, you may want to bring clothes to change into for other activities and swimming. We ask that you remember modesty at all times. (Please bring a change of play clothes – the girls may get wet in the bubble attraction.)

Will The CETC Graduates Be Recognized During The Awards Celebration?

Yes. For counselors graduating since the last Jamboree, recognition will be given. To be recognized, please complete any CETC work and send to International Women's Ministries by April 1, 2010.

Activities will include inflatable rides & games, swimming, canteen, "Over the Rainbow" Ministry Session, Wii Dance Revolution, paddleboats/canoes/kayaks, competitions, Chick-fil-A!
